# OUR VISION

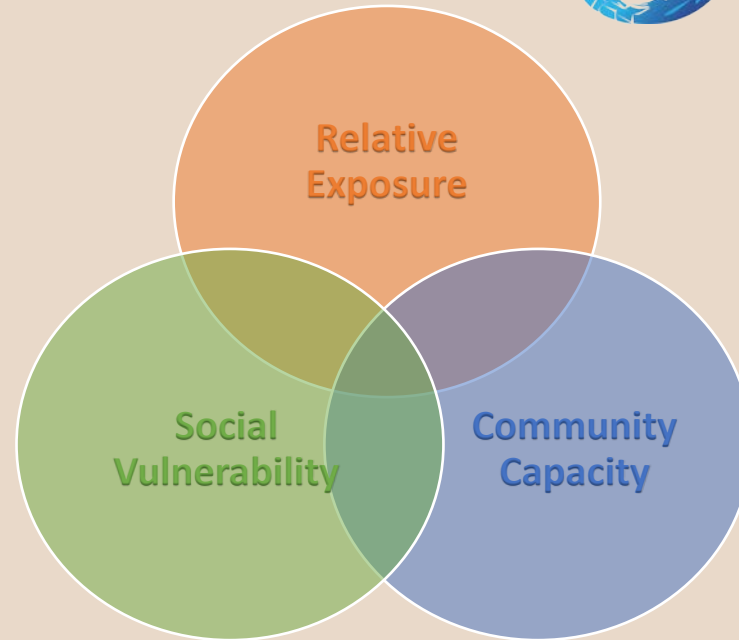
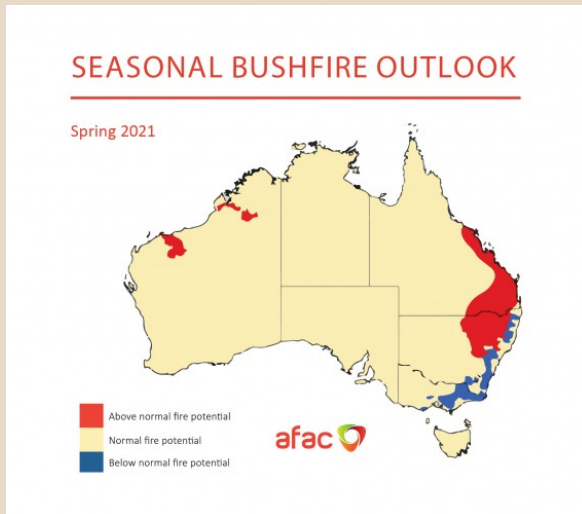

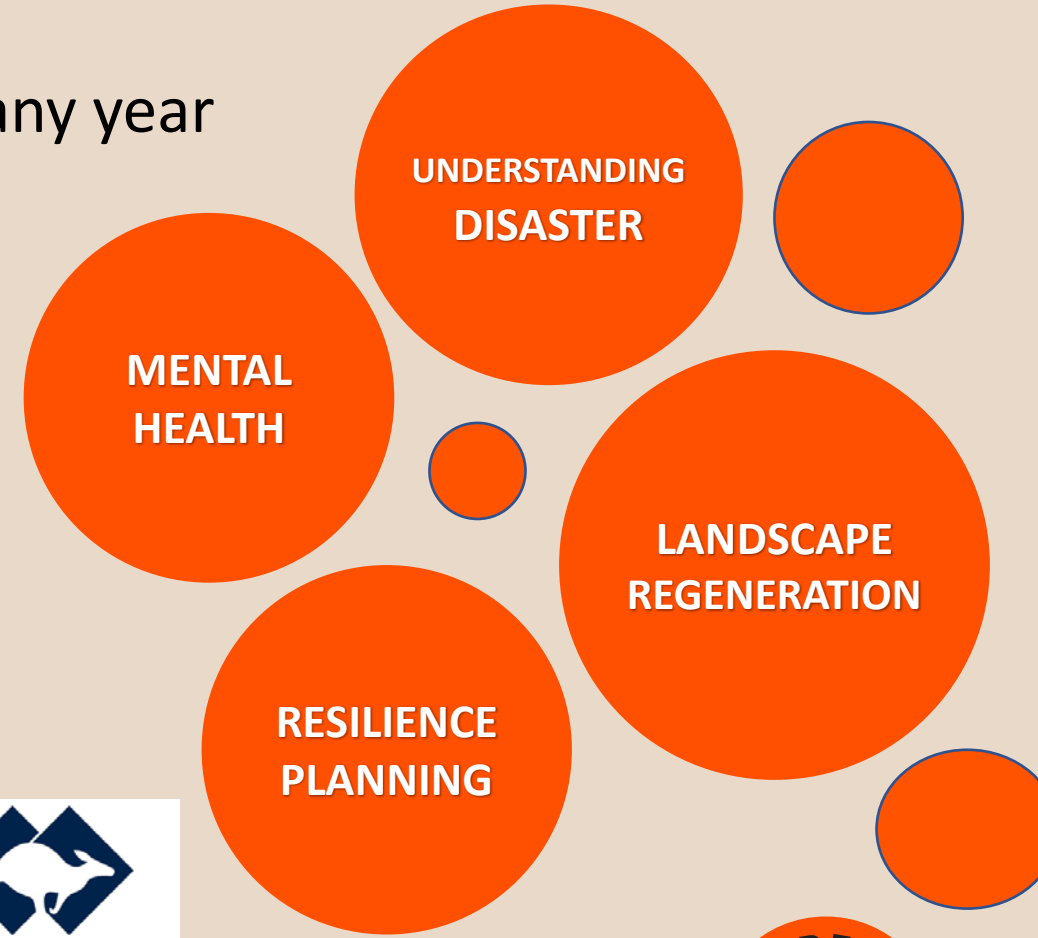


# Australian Resilience Corps
