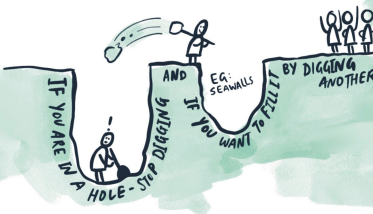


# Panel Discussion

Need to understand the cost & the BENEFITS + VALUE + RETURNS that Resilience gives them!

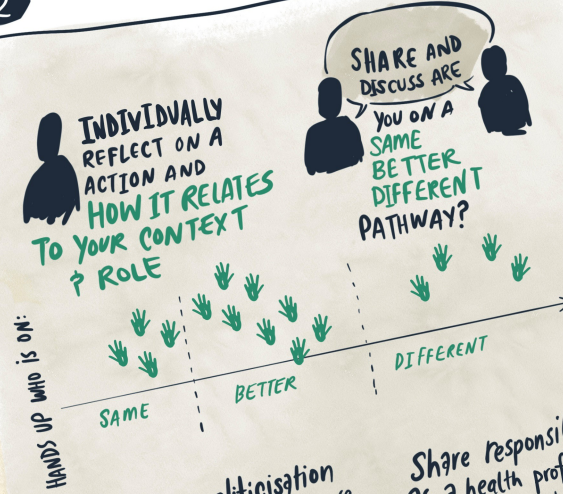
Communities are trying to make sense, have agency & create change. IF THIS ISN'T IN THE NAP IT'LL BE A FAILURE!

We need to be mindful on WHEN & HOW WE USE THE WORD "RESILIENCE" NOT INTERCHANGE IT

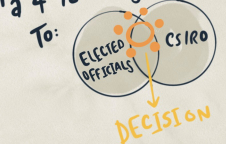
Not-for-profits are the first there & last to go. We need to authorise them, build to thrive in the system.
